The workshops will be run by individuals and groups developing theological practice out of mimetic anthropology. **PRE-CONFERENCE MIMETIC THEORY OVERVIEW:** A free-of-charge pre-conference program is offered from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm on Tuesday, June 5th, providing an immersion in Mimetic Theory, the anthropological understanding at the heart of Theology and Peace.
